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

ABOUT THE PCS BAND:

In 2013, Providence Christian School began its band program comprised of 6^{th} – 8^{th} grade students. The band hit the stands as a pep band playing at home football games in 2015. The next year, Mitchell Boles joined the PCS faculty as band director leading students in 5^{th} – 9^{th} grades. In 2017, the PCS band expanded to include tenth grade students.

Mitchell Boles has great plans for the future of our band at Providence. With a bachelor of music education from Baptist College of Florida, Boles has experience playing professionally in an orchestra and in a marching band. His vision for the next five to ten years is for PCS to have every student involved in music.

Below are the goals for band at PCS:

- Beginner band for 5th and 6th grades
- Intermediate and advanced junior high band for 7th – 8th grades
- Concert wind ensemble for 9th 12th grades with a potential wind symphony
- Marching band in five years (2022)
- Piano class for interested students
