Our students are given the opportunity to earn dual enrollment credit through the University of Mobile (UMobile). This opportunity comes without sacrificing our standards and expectations set forth by the founding board members of our school. Our faculty has met and exceeded the prerequisites to be adjunct instructors for The University of Mobile. Additionally, our curriculum has been evaluated and approved for the courses we are offering. The University of Mobile has confirmed that the rigorous coursework for our students at Providence constitutes earning college-level credits. PCS dual enrollment course offerings through the University of Mobile:

EN 101- Effective English I (also called English Comp I)- 11th grade

A course in composition and college level reading designed to provide training in critical thinking, reading skills, and analytical writing. Includes a study of research methods and the writing of documented papers in the context of an introduction to classical epic poetry, and selections of lyric poetry and prose writing.

EN 102- Effective English II (also called English Comp II)- 12th grade

A course in composition and college level reading designed to provide training in critical thinking, reading skills, and analytical writing. Includes a study of research methods and the writing of documented papers in the context of an introduction to classical and Christian epic poetry, and selections of lyric poetry and prose writing. Must be taken in sequence with EN 101.

HI 101- Western Civilization I- 11th grade

The study of civilizations of Ancient Greece, Rome, and the Near East; the Middle Ages; the Renaissance and Reformation; and early modern Europe.

HI 102 Western Civilization II- 12th grade

European history from the mid-17th century through the post-Second World War period including political, economic, and cultural developments such as scientific thought, the Enlightenment, the French and Industrial Revolutions, and the First and Second World Wars.

MA 113- Trigonometry- 11th or 12th grade

Functions, angles, circular functions, graphs, identities, equations, and inverse functions.

CST 101- Introduction to Biblical Theology 12th grade

An introduction Christian worldview, giving special attention to the foundations of historic, orthodox Christian faith, biblical ethics and theology, with application to issues of current interest, such as marriage and family, and citizenship. Other issues include Christian baptism, prayer, faith-learning integration, and testing of worldviews.
